STANMORE OPENS APPLICATIONS FOR \$5,000 AND \$10,000 COMMUNITY GRANTS

Stanmore Resources has opened Round Two of its 2025 Community Grant Program.

Central Queensland-based organisations are invited to apply for grants for projects or initiatives that highlight community health and wellbeing, support young people in the region, provide opportunities for Indigenous engagement or support the environment. The grants available include general grants of up to \$5,000 and significant project or initiative grants of up to \$10,000.

Since its establishment in 2019, the Stanmore Resources Community Grant Program has provided \$781,664 in funding to 151 local organisations across two funding rounds each year, contributing more than \$200,000 in 2024 alone.

In the first funding round of 2025, Simply Sunshine Kindergarten received \$3,500 to provide a more welcoming and inclusive entrance where staff, families and community can relax or connect.

This provides more meaningful cultural understanding for the children at the kindergarten through hands-on engagement with native flora and the traditional uses of bush tucker. It also strengthens Simply Sunshine's inclusive practices and builds stronger partnerships with the wider community.

\$2500 was also awarded to the Mackay Cyclones Swimming Club. The funding will be used to sponsor new uniforms for the club's swimmers who qualify for the Queensland State Swimming Championships, allowing them to represent their region with pride and confidence on the state stage.

The State Championships represent a major milestone for the Mackay Cyclone's young athletes, many of whom have trained extensively to meet the qualifying standards. For these young people, competing at a state level fosters a sense of achievement and builds their resilience and confidence.

Stanmore Resources Chief Executive Officer Marcelo Matos said the company is proud to support initiatives that deliver lasting value to the communities in which it operates.

"We're proud to help local not-for-profits and community organisations that provide initiatives benefiting the people they serve, whether it's creating welcoming outdoor spaces that celebrate cultural inclusion or backing young athletes as they represent their communities," Mr Matos said.

"Stanmore is delighted to help community groups, that often rely on the generosity of locals through fundraising, be in a position to fund important initiatives."

"Stanmore Resources is a key operator in Central Queensland, and we remain committed to giving back to the community each year. I encourage local community groups, clubs, schools and not-for-profit organisations to apply for our grants to help get their project off the ground."

Online applications for Round Two of the Stanmore Resources Community Grant Program are now open and close on 4 August 2025. Previous grant applicants and recipients are also encouraged to apply.
